2. **Students Against Vandalizing the Earth (SAVE)** sponsored the following slate of activities for Earth Week. We wish to thank SAVE advisor Mr. O'Neill and the executive officers for raising environmental awareness throughout the school and the community:

Tuesday, 22 April

Introductory video on this year's focus (climate change) and the week of activities. Homeroom was briefly extended to give students the opportunity to view the film and a link to the film on YouTube was provided.

Wednesday, April 23

Library showcases during the morning blocks on the topic of climate change.

Thursday, April 24

Lunchtime debate: "Is it ethical to restrict carbon emissions in emerging economies in order to curtail climate change?" featuring students Rob Servilio, Mike Mancuso, Ryan Moran, Chris Blackwood, and moderator Joelle Dowling. In addition, a tree planting co-sponsored by SAVE and the Human Rights clubs was held on the school grounds to plant a tree to commemorate both Earth Day and the twentieth anniversary of the Rwandan genocide.

Friday, April 25

A Downtown clean-up was held after school on the streets of Washington.

Saturday, April 26

SAVE participated in Green Fest 2014 in downtown Washington. The group offered information about climate change, as well as a free seed planting activity for kids!

3. Congratulations to our students and staff for their **humanitarian community service projects** held recently. These include the Varsity Softball team raised \$1,125 for cancer research during the 1st annual “Teal Game” on Thursday, 17 April. Special thanks to the band and chorus, faculty and administrators who participated in the activities and the Middle School staff for raising \$126.00 in the “Jeans Day” fundraiser for the upcoming Community Health Fair on 31 May 2014.

4. **Cluster articulation meetings** continue with Ms. Brown sponsoring both Art and Music articulation forums, and Mr. Dennison sponsoring a Social Studies articulation forum. During the Art articulation meeting, participants discussed connecting art with technology, art resources and free teacher workshops by the Metropolitan Museum of Art, along with the past Warren Hills Regional Fine Arts Showcase and enrichment ideas. During the Music articulation meeting, participants provided feedback on the middle school's scheduling of music opportunities, along with ideas for next year's showcase. During the Social Studies articulation meeting, participants focused on the Common Core and PARCC resources, such as the computer-based sample test items and the Model Content Frameworks, along with the C3 Framework – College, Career, and Civic Life. All cluster articulation meeting participants have been provided the Middle States/EBD overview pamphlet and the upcoming meeting dates and invitations have been extended for their input and participation.

5. The 2013-2014 **Exxon Mobil Grants** have been awarded to teachers at both the middle school and the high school. At the middle school, the Language Arts Literacy grade 8 teachers – Susan DeYoung, Heather Dilts, Courtney Flowers, Shannon Klinder, and Debbie Post – collectively received the award for their "Classroom Leveled Libraries" (Book Club Novels) in the amount of \$424.86. The award will allow them to provide expanded classroom libraries for increasing independent reading for all reading levels. At the high school, Mathematics teacher Daryl Detrick received the award for his "Oculus Rift" (3D virtual reality goggles) in the amount of \$350.00 for students in his Advanced Computer Science class to control games or other devices and to learn additional programming languages. Additionally, the application Oculus Rift will be used to inspire other students to pursue STEM careers, particularly computing careers.

6. Mrs. Moore and the Supervisors have been meeting individually with the departments' members to review and to calculate the **Student Growth Objective (SGO)** scores in order to analyze students' growth and

achievement on the chosen curriculum standards established last fall as part of the *Achieve NJ* initiative.

7. Mr. Steele, the Supervisor of Mathematics and Science, extends an invitation to the students and their parents from grades 6, 7, and 8 to attend the second annual **STEM (Science, Technology, Engineering, and Mathematics) Night** on Thursday, 8 May, at 7:00 PM at the Middle School.

8. Junior Robert Servilio scored a **perfect 800 on the math section** of the December S.A.T. Congratulations, Robert!!! Also, Robert and classmate Kenneth Wilson have been nominated and will receive recognition in the **2015 National Merit Scholarship Program**. Details of the recognition will be released to the school in September 2014!

9. Congratulations to over one hundred middle school students who earned the **Character Pillar Award** for “Trustworthiness.”

10. Tomorrow is an **early dismissal day** to allow professional development for our staff. We will be exploring important information regarding PARCC. The WHREA will be providing a staff appreciation luncheon with desserts from the PTSA prior to the in-service.

14. Sophomore Softball player Madey (Maddie) Smith was named **player of the week** in the *Express Times* for her performance in softball for the week of 7 – 11 April. For the week Madey pitched a 1-hitter, a no-hitter, and struck out 59 batters in 24 innings and had a batting average of .692.
