Prepared for Class

The following items are required each day of class:

1. Notebook – 3 ring binder would be best
2. Textbook (covered)
3. Completed homework assignment

5. Pass Book – each student will be allowed only one pass per week
6. Flash Drive / Memory Stick (recommended)

Make-Up Work

It is your responsibility to find out what work you missed when you were absent and to schedule a time to make it up. All test and quizzes should be made up within 1 week of your return to school. Homework must be made up within two days. Any work not made up within these time periods will be given a zero. You are also responsible to get any missed notes or journal entries from a classmate. Extended periods of absence will be dealt with on an individual basis.

Evaluation Criteria

The grading in this class is based on a points system. Each assignment will be given a points value. The number of points earned divided by the number of points possible will be your grade.

Sample Point Values

Quizzes	25-75 points
Tests	100 points
Essays	25-50 points

Class Software

All software that we will use in this class is free and multi-platform. It can all be downloaded on your home computers so that students can catch up on programming work if they are behind. I can give students a copy if they don't have Internet access.

Collaboration vs. Cheating

I encourage students to collaborate when problem solving. This includes discussing how to develop a program and help in debugging. However, copying lines from another students program is considered cheating. If I feel that students have cheated, all students involved will be given a zero for the assignment.

If you are modifying a program that someone else wrote, be sure to give the original author credit for their work and yourself credit for your modifications.

Computer Privileges

Use of the computer at Warren Hills is a privilege that can be revoked.

1. Students are expected to follow all school computer use policies.
2. Students should not touch or mess with others student's computers or files without permission.
3. Students should not use the Internet or other software without permission. There will be appropriate times for their use.
4. Students are to take care of the computers in an appropriate manner.
5. A student that does not obey these rules will lose their computer privilege from a day to the remainder of the year depending on the severity of the infraction.
